Tips on Answering a Land Law Problem Question

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The original test to distinguish fixtures (land) and fittings (chattels) is the 'degree of annexation test', although problems can arise with "temporary" or "lean to" buildings. Other things attached to land were seen as land so long as they were firmly attached.
